

ARS INTRINSICA – Images from the Human Body's Innermost Realms

(Linz, 11.05.2009) ARS INTRINSICA focuses on forms and structures of the human organism and of inanimate objects. Large-format prints reveal kaleidoscopic worlds of imagery that seem to be products of an artist's imagination but have actually been captured live by hightech equipment. Scientific techniques such as computed tomography and magnetic resonance imaging now being used in medical-radiological diagnostics generate mathematical visualizations that are then artistically recontextualized. ARS INTRINSICA, the work of Richard Giesemann (graphic designer), Anatole Ak (artist) and Dr. Franz Fellner (head of Linz General Hospital's radiology department,) features the extraordinary outcomes that can emerge from the interplay of scientific methods and artistic approaches. ARS INTRINSICA is on display May 13-August 30, 2009 in the Ars Electronica Center's Lobby.
