(Linz, April 29, 2013) Two breathtaking nature films screened in jumbo 16x9-meter format are this week's featured attractions at Ars Electronica Center Linz. On Wednesday, May 1, 2013 at 8:15 PM, Terra Mater's "Miracles of Life – Sense and Sensors" will shed some high-definition light on how various animals' sensory organs function, and show which physical tricks and techniques are now being used to help human beings sharpen their perceptive faculties. And at the next Deep Space LIVE on Thursday, May 2, 2013, Linz-based nature filmmaker Erich Pröll will present the first installment of his trilogy about mustangs, the legendary wild horses of North America.

Each presentation will feature ultra-high-definition imagery in 16×9-meter format and will be accompanied by expert commentary, entertaining stand-up repartee, and musical improvisation.
