The focus will be on the works of William Turner, one of the leading lights of the Romantic movement in English painting. It's made possible by the Google Art Project, a great way for internet users to visit museums all over the world and enjoy close-up views of countless art treasures.

About Martin Hochleitner

Art historian Martin Hochleitner was born in 1970 in Salzburg. From 1993 to 2000, he was on the staff of the Province of Upper Austria's cultural affairs agency, and, together with Peter Assmann, director of the Galerie im Stifterhaus. Since 1997, Martin Hochleitner has also taught in various capacities at Linz Art University. In 2000, he was named director of the Landesgalerie Linz at the Oberösterreichischen Landesmuseum and held that position until 2012. Since September 2012, Martin Hochleitner has been director of the Salzburg Museum.
